

## State Primary Care Association

This analysis estimates the impact of a **40% decline** in patient visits at **State Primary Care Association's (SPCA)** XX Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, **from March 2020 through March 2021**. It relies on audited financial data in Capital Link's proprietary database, HRSA Uniform Data System (UDS) data for 2019, and 2019 economic impact multipliers from IMPLAN.

**Summary Results:** Absent immediate remedies, **SPCA FQHCs** are projected to lose **\$94M** in revenue over the time period. It is estimated that **59%** of SPCA FQHCs will exhaust **100%** of their operating reserves, forcing the closure of sites and/or services. **Eighty-five percent** of centers will sustain operating deficits, which may limit these centers' abilities to respond to the current public health crisis. These losses will deplete the minimal reserves of health centers, requiring layoffs of **661** staff members, including front-line providers. Health center closure and job losses will also ripple through local economies, resulting in an additional **\$87M** in lost revenue and **486** lost jobs, compounding the crisis in communities that can least afford it. The **\$47M** in one-time COVID-19 relief funding represents the combined federal awards received by the health centers to mitigate COVID-19 related losses and expenses.
